

THE BRANDT SCHOOL

The Willy Brandt School of Public Policy at the University of Erfurt is *one of Germany's leading policy schools*.

- We train future leaders in government, civil society, and private enterprise in addressing the complex public policy challenges of our time.
- We are home to cutting-edge research on key areas in sustainable development, that is climate change, inequality, digitalization, violent conflict, and health.
- We generate impact by feeding results back to politics and society in general to inform evidence-based policy making.

The Brandt School is uniquely located in Thuringia's capital *Erfurt*, in the very center of the unified Germany, carrying deep historical significance from the Reformation to the Thirty Years' War, from Weimar to the Wall, with close infrastructural and intellectual ties to other important centers such as Berlin, Frankfurt, Prague, Brussels or Paris to name but a few.

THE MASTER OF PUBLIC POLICY

The Brandt School's Master of Public Policy (MPP) is a two-year *practice-oriented, international, and interdisciplinary degree program.* It is designed for young professionals who wish to pursue a career in public service, including government agencies, international organizations, and the non-profit sector.

Drawing from *political science, economics, sociology, public administration* and *law*, the MPP curriculum equips professional policy analysts and future decision makers with the knowledge and practical skills they will need to advance the public interest and make sound evidence-based policy decisions.

Throughout the coursework, research, and field experience, students *develop a deep understanding of the policy process and the involved institutions and actors*.



PROGRAM STRUCTURE

MPP candidates study two years full-time, earning a total of 120 credit points (ECTS). The first three semesters are dedicated to course work and the practical modules. During the fourth term, students write their thesis.

All students take eight core modules:

Core Modules

- · Introduction to Public Policy
- Economic Policy Analysis
- · Comparative and International Public Policy
- Public Administration and Finance
- · Management and Leadership
- Ethics in the Public Sector
- · Quantitative Methods
- · Advanced Methods

In addition, students may choose two out of four specializations:

Specialization Modules

- Non-Profit Management and Social Entrepreneurship
- International and Global Public Policy
- Development and Socio-Economic Policies
- Conflict Studies and Management

Practical Training Modules

Bridging the gap to the policy world is an important part of our teaching philosophy. MPP students, therefore, work with *external professional partners* and *solve real-world policy challenges* as part of a policy internship and a project group.

PROJECT GROUPS

During their third semester, MPP students implement a capstone – the project group – under the supervision of an academic staff member. They work in teams to address a tangible public policy problem for an external 'client', thus creating impact already during their studies.

Past clients include development agencies such as the German Agency for International Cooperation (GIZ), climate consultancies such as adelphi, state agencies such as the Thuringian Agency for Digitalization, non-partisan and charitable organizations such as the Transparency International, international financial institutions such as the European Investment Bank, or philanthropies such as the Open Society Foundations.

Language Module

Students improve their language competencies within several language modules. They may choose from a wide variety of languages. Basic German is compulsory for all students without prior knowledge of the language.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

The program prepares students for *careers in state-level* and national governments, public administration, international organizations, civil society, think tanks, consultancies, and other private companies.

Mainly training policy analysts and future leaders, the MPP has also paved the way for many alumni to work as social entrepreneurs, diplomats, development experts, politicians, journalists, managers, and researchers.



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- higher education entrance qualification (i.e., high school diploma)
- college or university degree (i.e., Bachelor, Master, Diploma, state exam, etc.) with a duration of at least six semesters, ideally in subjects from the social sciences, economics, or law
- professional work experience (minimum of one year)
- above-average grades or above-average professional performance
- strong analytical skills and pronounced interest in solving political problems
- excellent English language proficiency (TOEFL iBT: minimum 90 points, IELTS: minimum of 6.5 points in all disciplines, Cambridge CAE or CPE)



APPLICATION

We strongly recommend applying before our priority deadline, which ends on *February 28th* of each year. The MPP program officially begins each year on *October 1st*.
